

Christmas Dinner Dog Mat Tutorial

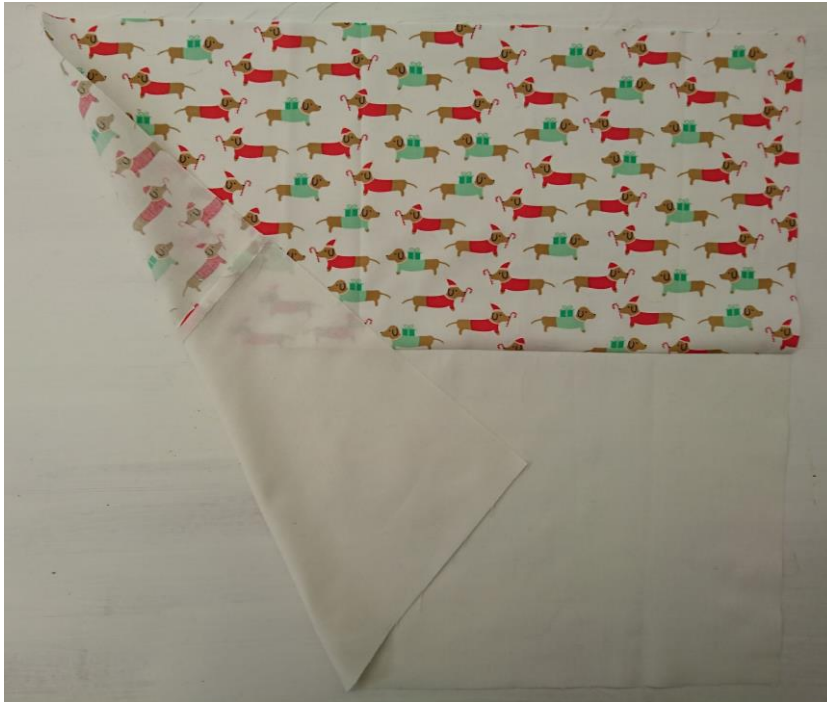
Supplies:

Order yours today from [olive and flo handcraft](#)

- Fat quarter of the Christmas Red Hearts
- Fat quarter of the Christmas Dachshunds in cream
- Fat quarter of metallic linen
- 2 fat quarters of the kona snow
- Cream threads
- Fat quarter of interlining (Vilene G700)
- Fabric marker pen, basic sewing supplies
- Batting 17" x 16"

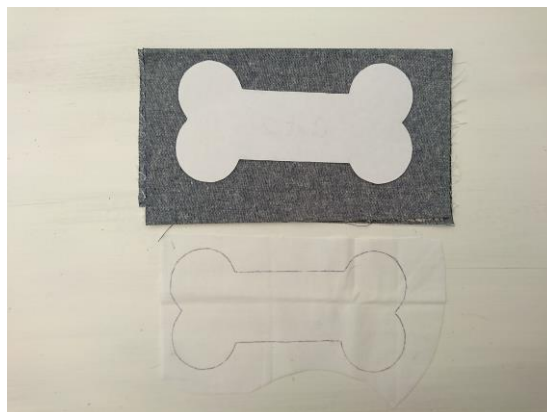
Let's begin:

Cut 1 rectangle measuring 17" x 8" from the Christmas Dachshunds fabric, and the same from the kona snow fabric. Sew these two pieces together using $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance, and press seam towards the pattern fabric.



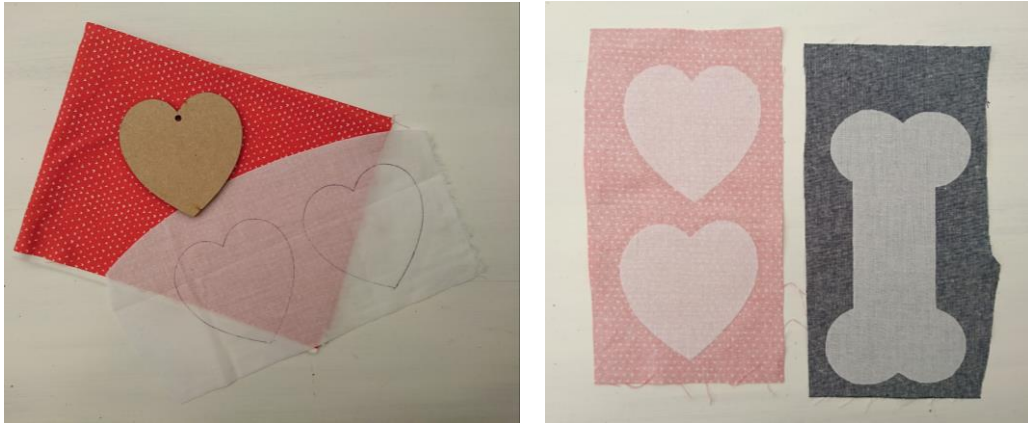
Cut 1 rectangle measuring 17" x 15" also from the kona snow fabric.

Print off a basic 8" dog bone template (measuring across the widest part) and draw this out on to your interlining, cut this out with excess interlining around it and iron fix it onto the reverse of the Christmas metallic linen fabric.



Repeat this process with a heart measuring 4" at the widest part, this time iron fix it to the reverse of the Christmas Red Hearts fabric, make 2 of these.

Then carefully cut out these appliques.



Place the metallic bone applique onto the dachshund fabric, and baste in place, using a little fabric glue. Repeat this process for the 2 red hearts, this time placing them on the kona snow fabric.

Using a cream thread, blanket stitch, around each applique. Sewing the loose threads to the reverse of the fabric.



Baste the batting to the reverse of the top piece of the placemat, place the bottom piece of kona snow fabric right sides together. Sew all the way around leaving a 4" gap, so your placemat can be turned right side out. Trim away any excess batting, and curve the corners. Press placemat, using a ladder stitch, sew up the gap. To keep your batting in place, sew a simple line of stitching in cream thread across the middle of the tablemat.
